It was great to see all the children again after a year. We enjoyed a new VBS called ROAR. The theme was "When life is wild - God is good." The VBS had Africa as part of it's theme and setting. It was fun to talk to the children about their country, the continent of Africa and how awesome it is. They explored stories of the Israelites when they were slaves in Egypt, how God set them free and looked after them in the desert. New songs were taught and the children enjoyed singing and dancing to the new tunes. We did something new this year and introduced the station "Spotlight Drama." The children were divided into groups and each day one group had their photos taken while they posed according to a script. These photos were put into a Power Point presentation. During the evening devotions, I showed the presentation. The children loved seeing themselves as the characters in the Bible story.

ROAR VBS included testimonies on DVD from children who live in Zambia. Their stories resinated with the children of MCCH. They heard from 5 different children who live in tough circumstances in comparison to North American standards. In one of the testimonies, a boy and his sister had to walk an hour to a neighbouring village to go to school after their early morning chores. The school they attend is a small room with a dirt floor and the teacher's lessons were being heard over a radio. At the end of this story, I asked the children what they thought about the children in the story. The MCCH children heard the struggles of the children and commented on how thankful they were for the school that they attend, their teacher and the uniform they get to wear. Each testimony helped the children see God's goodness in all things including when life is unfair, when life is scary, when life changes, when life is sad and when life is good - God is good.
